Jamil, IFES Regional Secretary for the Middle East and North Africa region, started his journey to faith in Paris as an international student from Tunisia when a group of French students extended their kindness to him and introduced him to the gospel.

More recently, the lives of international students from South Asia studying in a former Soviet state in Central Asia were transformed when students from the IFES movement there befriended and helped them. In that country they were seen as foreigners to be exploited and faced great hostility. From welcoming them into their homes to helping them with police and housing issues, Christian students gave them a completely different experience of overseas study and, most importantly, a vivid picture of God's love for them.

## THIS MOMENT

On 15 October, IFES World Student Day, over 30,000 students, staff and supporters in 144 countries prayed for student ministry - including at least three countries currently without an IFES movement. 156 prayer cards were submitted from over 65 countries and used by individuals, student groups and churches all over the world.

Each year it is such a joy to hear from participants ranging in age from high school to their 90s, and to see movement calls to prayer on social media - this year from St Lucia, Tanzania, Venezuela, Togo, Brazil and Armenia, to name a few.

Social media shows us the amazing connections across the Fellowship, with Zambians praying for Ethiopians, Ecuadorians praying for Bolivians, Taiwanese praying for Australians and Scots praying for Slovenians. Students met to pray in El Salvador, prayer walked in Nigeria and India, and ate together after praying in Australia, Scotland and the Netherlands. Movements like KIVF South Korea translated IFES resources to help

students pray for their peers elsewhere, TSCF New Zealand sent hourly text messages to students on exam leave and IVCF Philippines in Bicol region invited a speaker to their online regional prayer meeting to encourage students that it was their time to reach out with the good news.

National online prayer meetings were held in many places including South Africa, Trinidad and Tobago and Indonesia. Online gatherings across borders are always the most exciting. This year they included a Spanish language gathering of participants from IFES movements in Argentina, Chile, Mexico, Uruguay, Equatorial Guinea and Australia and an English language meeting for staff and students in Canada, Greenland, the Netherlands and Poland. Also encouraging was seeing students in the US praying with students from across the MENA region.

Praise God with us for the power of united prayer and ask him to keep students prayerfully choosing to use each moment for his glory.

Sobremesa aims to help IFES students welcome people from every nation, tribe, and tongue to their tables by providing resources about cross-cultural communication, building genuine relationships, leading Bible studies, and partnering with the local church.

### **IFES PERSON: LENA WELCH**

Lena's story reflects the joy of IFES ministry. A friend invited her to an CCX Ukraine group at a nearby university when she was a student. After committing her life to Christ, she was involved in pioneering a new student group at her university, and went on to serve with CCX Ukraine, including as co-leader of the movement. Since 2011, she has served with IFES Eurasia, particularly investing in training and development of staff not just in the region, but globally through her role as a mentor on the IFES Global Leaders' Initiative. All of this experience has shown her how essential it is for IFES to support and equip national movements to thrive.

Newly appointed by Tim Adams to his senior staff team, Lena will be bringing together several IFES ministries, including Governance Development, Scripture Engagement and Indigenous Support Development. These ministries support and strengthen local movements, building capacity and skills for long term sustainability. She will be listening to those who know their students, universities and local context best, discerning where God is working and guiding.

Lena asks us to pray for her as she settles into this role and develops her team. Ask God to give them discernment, creativity and wisdom to identify new needs and to adapt or develop new resources and ministries to serve IFES movements.
