# FUNDRAISING IDEAS

**So, you want to raise some money for IFES World Assembly – for your own costs, for someone else's, or for the Scholarship Fund.**

So what next? Do you want to do something alone? Or with a group? What can you do, how can it be organised? How should you send in the money to IFES?

## EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Fundraising events are a great way to raise money whilst having fun. They are also a great chance to raise awareness about IFES and World Assembly. Some things you might like to try:

1. **Indonesian Night** Serve traditional food and do some Indonesian inspired activities. Resources available in this pack.
2. **International Quiz Night** Quiz questions can be downloaded from the IFES World Assembly website.
3. **Bake Sale, Coffee Morning or Afternoon Tea** Maybe try an Indonesian cake recipe. Recipe links available in this pack.
4. **Sports Competition** The most popular sports in Indonesia are badminton, football, volleyball and basketball.
5. **Every penny counts!** At your church or student group make a large map of Indonesia and ask people to help you fill it in with pennies or small change.
6. **Odd jobs** Can you or your group offer to do odd jobs for people? Cleaning, babysitting, gardening, dog walking, car-washing etc.
7. **Talent Show** Hold a talent show or other performance in your student/church/youth group and sell tickets.
8. **Arts & Crafts Sale** Make paintings, jewellery or other crafts to sell.
9. **Jumble Sale or Swap Shop**
10. **Treasure Hunt** Create a treasure hunt around your campus or local area and charge a small fee for teams to enter and hunt for a prize.

## SPONSORED EVENTS

### TikTok challenge

Did you know Indonesia is one of the biggest social media markets in the world, with over 80% of their population engaged. Does your group or do you have TikTok? Why not try to see who can create the best Indonesian themed TikTok, cooking a recipe, trying a dance or sharing a fun fact and link people to your giving page. And make sure to tag @perkantas and @ifesworld and add the #IFESWA

### Electronic Shutdown

Many delegates will be travelling for a long time to get from their homes to Indonesia. With most airlines they will have limited or no access to calls, text messages and the internet for the duration of their flight. They then might only have very limited access due to the cost of roaming charges.

How long can you cope for without using your phone, tablet, netbook or computer? Use the distances and flight times resource as the basis for your sponsored challenge.

### Sponsored Walk / Swim / Run / Cycle / Row / Skate / Ski

Could you organise a sponsored walk/swim/run/cycle/row/skate/ski? Perhaps you could do 1 metre for every km or mile between your country and World Assembly.

### Wild and Wacky

What unusual thing would people sponsor you to do? In 2011, an IFES staff member dyed their hair purple! For 2019, another wore brightly coloured wigs every day for a week. Could you dye your hair in the colours of the Indonesian flag? Wear a superhero costume every Tuesday for a month? Eat nothing but rice and beans for a week? Be creative!

### Language Challenge

According to the 2010 Census there are over 700 languages spoken in Indonesia, making it the second most linguistically diverse nation in the world after Papua New Guinea. Choose a language you don't already know and ask people to sponsor you (or a group of friends) to see how many phrases you can learn in two weeks, 20? 30? 50? You can find phrases in many of the languages here: <http://www.omniglot.com/language/phrases> or look on YouTube for some video lessons. You could make a video of you speaking your new language to show all your sponsors, or be tested at a themed fundraising event.

### Exercise Bike Challenge

If you are scared of the weather, or want an indoor task for your particular group, consider an exercise bike challenge. You and your group have to keep the exercise bike going for a specified amount of time, perhaps the amount of time that a student might need to travel to get from their home city to Indonesia, or for a period which has a significance for you or your group. ### Lent Challenge

Give up your favourite food / activity for Lent – ask for sponsorship or put aside the money you would have spent on these things.

## INDONESIAN EVENT

An Indonesian themed event could be a great fundraiser. Invite your friends, family or church members to come to your home for a small donation to eat Indonesian food, listen to Indonesian music, learn a dance, or watch an Indonesian film. Why not make friends with some Indonesian students on campus – they can tell you more about Indonesian cultures and give you even more ideas!

There are many great Indonesian films to watch. For some films we have suggested minimum age guidelines for watching based on UK film certificates, but please consider whether a film is suitable for your audience and context.

**Garuda di Dadaku** (2009) (PG)

A talented 12-year-old boy dreams of becoming a great soccer player despite his loving grandfather's stern disapproval.

**My Stupid Boss** (2016) (12A)

After moving to Kuala Lumpur, Diana lands a secretary job at an ironworks owned by her husband's old college friend, possibly the world's worst boss.

**Kartini** (2017) (PG)

In the early 1900s, when Indonesia was still a colony of the Netherlands, women weren't allowed to get higher education. Kartini grew up to fight for equality for women.

**Dilan 1990** (2018) (12)

At a Bandung high school, charming and rebellious Dilan vies for the affections of shy new student Milea.

**Gundala** (2019) (15)

Indonesia's preeminent comic book superhero and his alter ego Sancaka enter the cinematic universe to battle the wicked Pengkor and his diabolical squad of orphan assassins.

**Photocopier** (2021) (15)

After losing her scholarship when photos of her at a party surface online, a student pairs with a photocopy worker to piece together what happened.

### INFORMATION FOR DELEGATES

#### Raising Money For Your World Assembly Fee

You can collect donations in cash, by transfer to your national movement bank account (ask your delegation manager for these details) or use a local online sponsorship site - ask your national movement if they have set one up, or can recommend one, as this may be the best way to collect donations towards your costs. This money should be given to your national movement as per the instructions they will provide.
